

Prevent Duty Statement

Version 1.0 — 01 May 2026

Learner-Friendly Summary

SBK Teaching Standards is committed to safeguarding learners and helping prevent people from being drawn into extremism or radicalisation. As an online-only education provider, we promote British Values, provide Prevent awareness training, and monitor learner activity through Moodle. If a concern is raised, it will be reviewed and escalated to the appropriate Prevent authority based on the learner's location.

1. Purpose

This Prevent Duty Statement outlines how SBK Teaching Standards meets its responsibilities under the Counter-Terrorism and Security Act 2015. It sets out:

- How Prevent is embedded in our online learning environment
- How concerns can be reported
- How risks are assessed and managed
- How British Values are promoted
- How Prevent responsibilities are fulfilled by the organisation

2. Scope

This statement applies to:

- All learners enrolled on SBK Teaching Standards courses
- All online learning activities delivered through MoodleCloud
- All communication channels used by the organisation
- All safeguarding and Prevent-related concerns

SBK Teaching Standards is a **sole-trader online education provider**, delivering **asynchronous adult-education courses**. It is **not** an Ofsted-regulated provider and does **not** deliver funded provision or face-to-face learning.

3. Prevent Lead

The Prevent Lead for SBK Teaching Standards is:

Clerissa (Sole Trader owner)

- Completed Prevent training
- Responsible for reviewing concerns
- Responsible for escalation to the appropriate Prevent authority
- Responsible for maintaining Prevent awareness across the organisation

4. Learner Demographic

SBK Teaching Standards provides online courses to:

- Adults (18+)
- UK-based learners
- International learners
- Professionals (including dance teachers, educators, and public-facing roles)
- Members of the general public

This diverse demographic is reflected in the risk assessment and safeguarding approach.

5. Reporting Concerns

Learners can report Prevent-related concerns through:

There is **no phone contact available**.

All concerns are treated seriously and handled confidentially.

6. Escalation of Concerns

SBK Teaching Standards will escalate Prevent concerns to:

“The appropriate Prevent authority based on the learner’s location.”

This ensures that referrals are made to the correct regional Prevent team or safeguarding authority.

7. Prevent Approach

7.1 Promotion of British Values

SBK Teaching Standards actively promotes the following British Values across its courses:

- Democracy
- Rule of law
- Individual liberty
- Mutual respect
- Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs

These values are embedded in course content, examples, and professional-practice expectations.

7.2 Prevent Awareness

SBK Teaching Standards offers:

- A **Prevent Awareness Course**
- An **Adult Safeguarding Course**

These courses help learners understand:

- What Prevent is
- How radicalisation can occur
- How to recognise vulnerability
- How to report concerns
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7.3 Monitoring

As an online-only provider with no live sessions, monitoring is conducted through:

- Moodle activity
- Assessment submissions
- Communication patterns
- Behavioural indicators in written work

There is **no live chat, video, or real-time interaction**, reducing inherent risk.

8. Risk Assessment

8.1 Inherent Risk Level

SBK Teaching Standards is assessed as:

Low Risk

This is due to:

- Asynchronous online delivery
- No live sessions
- No physical premises
- Adult learners
- Limited interaction between learners
- Clear safeguarding and Prevent reporting routes

8.2 Risk Controls

To mitigate risk, SBK Teaching Standards:

- Provides Prevent and safeguarding training
- Monitors Moodle activity
- Reviews assessment content for concerning indicators
- Ensures all communication channels are monitored
- Maintains clear reporting and escalation procedures
- Promotes British Values across all courses

9. Staff Training

As a sole trader, the Prevent Lead:

- Has completed Prevent training
- Reviews training annually
- Ensures Prevent awareness is reflected in course design
- Maintains up-to-date knowledge of Prevent responsibilities

10. Responding to Concerns

When a Prevent concern is raised:

1. The Prevent Lead reviews the information
2. The level of risk is assessed
3. Additional information may be gathered from Moodle activity
4. A decision is made regarding escalation
5. If required, the concern is referred to the appropriate Prevent authority
6. A record is kept securely in line with data-protection requirements

11. Data Protection

All Prevent-related information is handled in accordance with:

- UK GDPR
- Data Protection Act 2018
- SBK Teaching Standards' Data Protection & Information Security Policy

Only essential information is shared with external authorities.

13. Review Cycle
